



## KELLEY GUTH

Head Coach  
7th Season  
Florida State, 1996

In fielding one of her youngest teams since the beginning of the program, Lady Govs head coach Kelley Guth's hunger is apparent. Of the 22-player roster, only three upperclassmen lead 19 freshman and sophomores looking for another taste of the Ohio Valley Conference tournament.

In back-to-back seasons Austin Peay edged its way into postseason play only to be a victim of first-round ousters. Then in 2007, the drought struck as the Lady Govs went winless against OVC opponents. Now Guth has reloaded with young talent to compliment the program's all-time leading offensive threat, Ashley Beck, in search of conference success.

Guth began her collegiate soccer career at Simon Fraser University in Burnaby, B.C. where she led her squad as a twotime NAIA first-team All-America selection and twice selected conference player of the year. In 1993, her first season with the Clan, Guth was an NAIA All-America honorable mention. She improved that her second season as the Clan claimed a conference championship and she collected first-team All-America honors.

In 1995, she again received first-team All-America honors, while Simon Fraser placed fifth in the NAIA national tournament. In 1996, she transferred for one season at Florida State University and left her mark in those record books as well. In one season, Guth scored 14 goals, including six game-winners that stands first all-time at FSU. Her 29 points and 56 shots on goal are single-season records as well.

Florida State University High School gave Guth her coaching start in 1997, where she coached for three seasons. While coaching at FSU High School, she also played in the W-League, a national amateur league, for the Fort Collins Force. With the Force, Guth received all-tournament honors as well as player of the week honors twice, as the Force took home the 1998 W-League championship.

Guth also played for the Florida State women's club team and was named women's open division MVP of the National Intramural-Recreation Sports Association. Guth received her initial Division I soccer coaching opportunity with Ohio Valley Conference member Southeast Missouri under her former FSU head coach Heather Nelson. As an assistant coach in 2000 and 2001, Guth was in charge of recruiting, academic oversight of student-athletes as well as overseeing all travel arrangements while assisting in practice with all positions on the field.

Southeast Missouri finished 10-6-1, third in the conference, in 2000; improving to 16-2 and an undefeated conference season, finishing first in 2001. Guth's inaugural season with the Lady Govs

was indeed a challenge, finishing 0-13-3, the team scoring only nine goals. However, the Lady Govs steadily improved during their second season, posting five wins and 25 goals. In 2004, the Lady Govs continued to mature on the field behind Guth's leadership. After a rough start, they finished strong with a conference victory at Murray State. The Lady Govs posted the program's best record yet, 8-9-2 overall and 1-6-1 in the league, scoring 29 goals.

Guth spearheaded the construction of Morgan Brothers Soccer Field in the summer of 2005 and opened the season with a home field for the first time. The Lady Govs have since well-defended the home pitch, posting a 6-0-1 OVC record in Clarksville. Guth has led the Lady Govs to two consecutive postseasons, making a steady improvement each season at the helm.

Her accomplishments as a player and coach continued to be recognized as she was inducted into the Delta (British Columbia) Sports Hall of Fame, in June 2004. Guth was one of 10 inductees into the inaugural class, selected from a group of 60. Guth, who also assists the Clarksville Royals Futbol Club in their player development program, currently resides in Clarksville with her husband Matt, who works as a correctional officer for the Davidson County Sheriffs Department in Nashville.



## JEREMY SULLIVAN

Assistant Coach  
2nd Season  
Jacksonville State, 2003

Jeremy Sullivan joined the Lady Govs program in the fall of 2007 as the goalkeepers coach after two years as a graduate assistant at Belmont. Sullivan also will serve as the recruiting coordinator.

The Alabama native played college soccer at Wallace State Community College, in Hanceville, Ala., where he led the Lions to a 15th National Ranking in his final season. He then transferred to Jacksonville State where he completed his degree recreation administration. As an undergrad, Sullivan worked three seasons as a student assistant.

In that time, Sullivan also worked at Donoho School as the head coach. At Belmont, Sullivan earned his master's of education while working as a graduate assistant and goalkeepers coach for the Bruins. Sullivan also was the head coach of the Brentwood Eclipse U13. Sullivan holds his NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and a USSF Class D license.

Sullivan lives in Clarksville with his wife, Jessica, who will have their first child around January 14, 2009.



## ALLIE LIBBY

The connection between Allie Libby and Austin Peay soccer is not easily seen by the naked eye. A St. Louis native, Libby brings a somewhat familiar perspective to the pitch in Clarksville having played on a young team in a young program at Delta State. Libby, and her twin sister Angie, each played four years for the Lady Statesman beginning with the program's inaugural season in 2004.

And a good four years it was, as Libby balanced the midfield consistently. She was named Most Improved in 2005 and shared the Delta State Lady Statesmen Athletic Award in 2006 and 2007 with her sister Angie. In the classroom, Libby was named to the Dean's List three times, as well as to the Gulf South Conference Honor Roll.

Libby played her high school soccer at Lindbergh in St. Louis. She was all-conference and all-area, while being named her team's offensive Most Valuable Player. Libby played defender and in the midfield for J.B. Marine Soccer Club and had three years of experience in the Missouri Olympic Development Program from 2000-03.

Austin Peay State University completed its search for an assistant athletic trainer, adding Autumn Davis in Fall 2008. Davis will provide athletic training for Lady Govs soccer and softball teams.

Davis, a Springfield, Ohio native, is a 2005 graduate of the University of Toledo with a bachelor's of science in athletic training. She first began to further her education at Georgia Southern, where she worked with volleyball, cross-country and track and field. In fact, she assisted at the 2006 Southern Conference Championships in each of those sports.

In Spring 2006, she worked as a rehabilitation technician at the East Georgia Regional Medical Center providing first aid to athletes during GSU intramural sports events. From there, she moved to Bloomington, Ill., where she worked as a graduate assistant at Illinois State.

At Illinois State, she first worked with Advanced Physical Therapy Services covering Central Illinois and Illinois Fusion soccer leagues. She also worked with Bloomington High School and Bloomington's Sports Enhancement Center as an athletic trainer.

5-5 • Senior • Forward

**2007:** Beck started 18 of 19 games played... led team in points (26), goals (12), shots on goal (35) and scored game-winning goals Sept. 21 vs. Lipscomb and Oct. 1 vs. Alabama A&M... set a single-season record with 26 points... her 12 goals were a regular-season league best, ranking in the top-three all-time in six different offensive categories ... ended her junior season with second-team All-OVC recognition and the 2007-08 APSU Women's Soccer MVP... Aug. 31 vs. Evansville, scored the lone goal in the season opener, Lady Govs lost, 2-1... Sept. 14 vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Beck scored once and assisted on two other goals in a 6-0 shutout... Sept. 23 vs. Winthrop, Beck led a second-half rally with two game-tying goals en route to a 3-2 come-from-behind win... in fact, Beck scored in four straight games from Sept. 21 – Oct. 1; the Lady Govs went 3-1 during that stretch... Sept. 28 at Tennessee Tech, Beck scored the Lady Govs only goal as they lost their league opener... suffered season-long offensive drought Oct. 12 – Oct. 19 going without a goal or assist in three games... bounced back to score a goal in each of her last four contests... scored the Lady Govs only goal in losses to Samford and Morehead State, as well as in a tie with Eastern Kentucky.

**2006:** As a sophomore, Beck was one of three players (Adonia Bivins and Erica Dengler) to start all 19 games...despite battling against double-teams most of the year, she was named second-team All-OVC for the second time... for the second-straight year, she led the Lady Govs in scoring with seven goals and three assists for 17 points... Beck led the team in points (17), shots (71), goals (7) and game-winning goals (2)...she was third among conference players in points and game-winning goals, second in shots and fifth in goals... her 71 shots are a single-season record, the most since Bivins' fired 61 shots in 2003... Beck averaged 3.74 shots per game... 8/25 vs. Evansville, she got off to a great start, scoring a goal and recorded an assist in the season's first match...9/1 at East Tennessee, she continued to have the hot hand, scoring one goal on five shots as the Lady Govs won, 3-2... 9/12 vs. Lipscomb, she posted her season's first game-winner, heading in a cross from Erica Dengler in the 27th minute leading the Lady Govs to a 1-0 victory...9/17 vs Chattanooga, Beck went off for a pair of goals on 10 shots in a 3-1 Lady Govs win... 10/6 vs Southeast Missouri, Beck came up big in overtime, taking a Redhawk turnover and drilling it into the upper 90 for the game-winner... Austin Peay was 5-1 when Beck scored a goal.

**2005:** As a freshman, she played in 16 games, starting 13... She was named to the All-OVC second team and All-Newcomer team... She scored seven goals during the season... 9/11 vs. Belmont, she scored the only goal in a Lady Govs 1-0 win... 9/25 vs. UT Martin, she found the back of the net in the 89th minute to take the game into overtime... 10/16 vs. Eastern Kentucky, she scored the only two goals in a 2-1 win... Beck led the Lady Govs in points (14), goals (7), and game-winning goals (3)... She also ranked fourth in goals, points per game, and goals per game in the OVC.

**High School:** Beck led Rossvie to three consecutive District 10 titles as well as two straight Region 5 second-place finishes... Beck posted 61 goals and added 33 assists in her high school career... She was named All-Area Player of the year and All-State in 2003...
